The following groups of people will receive benefits through a different state- or federally-supported program (not through Kentucky HEALTH):

- People on Medicare
- Medicaid recipients who are elderly, blind and/or disabled
- Residents of nursing facilities and Intermediate care/MR facilities
- Children in foster care or receiving subsidized adoption
- Women in the Breast and Cervical Cancer Treatment Program
- Supplemental Security Income recipients
- Working disabled adults in the Medicaid buy-in program
