

WHAT ARE SOME EXAMPLES OF PATH COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES?

Below are some examples of activities that count towards the PATH Community Engagement requirement. Note: The My Rewards Account amounts only apply if you participated in more than 80 hours of PATH activities for the month.

PATH Activity	Activity Definition	PATH Hour Equivalent	My Rewards Account Amount	Recommended Documentation
Job Search	<p>Looking for a job on your own or going to a free job search training at a local career center. Examples of qualifying job search activities include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Attending a community job fair • Submitting job application • Attending a job interview • Searching for available jobs • Attending a job search training 	1 hour: 1 PATH Hours	<p>\$5.00 per reported activity</p> <p>Limit to 12/year</p>	<p>Recommended documentation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Copy of application • Contact information of interviewer • Details of online job search (i.e. website used) • Job fair flyer
Education	<p>Going to school, or other educational program. Examples of qualifying general education courses include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • High School • Basic Skills/ Adult Literacy • English as a Second Language • College/ University/ Graduate Education • Vocational or Trade School 	1 hour = 1 PATH Hours	<p>\$25 per reported activity</p> <p>Limit to 2x per year</p>	<p>Individuals completing general education activities should enter the name of the institution providing the education, as well as relevant enrollment information.</p> <p>Recommended documentation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Certificate of completion • Attendance record • Enrollment verification from the institution.
GED Class	GED prep classes that prepare attendee for taking the GED exam	1 hour : 1 PATH hour	<p>\$25 per reported activity</p> <p>Limit to twice per year</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Attendance record/sign in

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GED Exam	Taking the GED exam	1 hour : 1 PATH hour	\$100 with successfully passing the exam Limit 1 time	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Attendance record/sign in Passing score document
Employment	<p>Working at a job that earns money. Examples of employment include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Standard Employment; Subsidized Employment; <p>Note: Individuals who are employed more than 30 hours per week are deemed to comply and do not have to report their hours on a monthly basis.</p>	1 hour: 1 PATH Hour	N/A	<p>Individuals will be required to attest to the number of hours worked, name of employer, and location.</p> <p>Recommended Documentation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Pay stubs
Self-Employment	<p>Self-employment with taxable income.</p> <p>Examples of self-employment include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Self-Employment (i.e. Housekeeping, Farming, Babysitting, lawn service, etc.) 	1 hour: 1 PATH Hour	N/A	<p>Individuals will be required to attest to the number of hours worked, name of employer, and location.</p> <p>Recommended Documentation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tax documents Pay stubs
Training	<p>Training that furthers employment skill and education activity:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Unpaid Internships. Employer sponsored training programs 	1 hour: 1 PATH Hour	N/A	<p>Individuals will be required to attest to the number of hours worked, name of organizations, and location.</p> <p>Recommended Documentation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Verification may be provided by the organization via organization statement, QR code scan, text, email, or electronic check in

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Community Service	Volunteering in your community through community service activities at a community organization, non-profit or faith-based organization.	1 hour: 1 PATH Hour	\$10 per reported activity Limit of 5 times per year	Individuals will be required to attest to the number of volunteer hours, the name of the sponsoring organization, and description of the volunteer activity. Additional verification documents: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Attendance verification from program coordinator (text, email) QR Code scan
Caregiving	Caregiving services include unpaid services provided to a non-dependent adult or child in the community. Qualifying caregiving services may be provided to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Individuals living with a disabling medical condition; Elderly individuals; and Non-dependent children (i.e. unpaid babysitting services for a relative). 	1 hour: 1 PATH Hour	N/A	Individuals claiming the PATH hours will need to enter detailed information about the caregiving services, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Number of hours; Name and address of the individual the services are provided to; and Description of the caregiving services provided (i.e. light housekeeping; cooking; medicine; babysitting; companion services) <p>At this time, documentation to verify the age or disability of the individuals to whom services are provided is not required.</p> <p>Recommended Documentation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Signed statement from person being cared for or their authorized representative Verification statement from healthcare provider Verification statement from the person to whom services are provided.

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Substance Use Disorder Treatment	<p>Individuals participating in drug or alcohol treatment programs from a certified or licensed provider. SUD treatment activities include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Counseling from a licensed provider or trained peer recovery coach; • Attending support group meetings (i.e. alcohol anonymous); • Participation in residential or inpatient SUD treatment program; • Participation in intensive outpatient program. 	1 hour: 1 PATH Hour	N/A	<p>Recommended Documentation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • MCO will verify activity when covered benefit. • Program documentation • Provider verification • Attendance record • Facility documentation • Facilitator documentation • Other relevant documents
